Dear Consulting Party,

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) with funding from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) proposes to proceed with the I-65/I-70 North Split Interchange Reconstruction Project (North Split Project) in the City of Indianapolis, Marion County (Des. Nos. 1592385 & 1600808). HNTB Corporation is under contract with INDOT to advance the environmental documentation for the referenced project.

Project Location

The proposed undertaking includes the I-65/I-70 North Split interchange; south along I-65/I-70 to the Washington Street interchange; the portion of I-65 west of the North Split interchange to approximately Meridian Street; and, the portion of I-70 east of the North Split interchange to approximately the bridge over Valley Avenue (west of the Keystone Avenue/Rural Street interchange) in downtown Indianapolis, Marion County, Indiana. It is within Center Township, Beech Grove United States Geological Survey (USGS) Topographic Quadrangle, in Section 36, Township 16N, Range 3E; Sections 1 and 12, Township 15N, Range 3E; and Section 31, Township 16N, Range 4E.

State Certificate Approval Dual Review Process

Please note that per the permanent rule issued by the Indiana Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) effective August 14, 2013 (312 IAC 20-4-11.5), INDOT is requesting that this project be subjected to "dual review"; that is, reviewed by the Division of Historic Preservation and Archaeology (DHPA) simultaneously under 54 U.S.C. 306108 (Section 106) and IC 14-21-1-18 (Indiana Preservation and Archaeology Law dealing with alterations of historic sites and structures requiring a Certificate of Approval).

Ms. Mandy Ranslow, FHWA Liaison/Program Analyst from the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, should be added to the list of consulting parties for processing the dual review submission. In addition, Mr. Mark Godley has replaced Mr. Pete Haupers as the St. Joseph Historic Neighborhood Association representative. Contact information for both are included in Attachment A.

Historic Property Effects Report

A Section 106 Historic Property Effects Report has been prepared for the project. The report analyzes and recommends a Section 106 effect finding for each historic property. The Historic Property Effects Report is available for review in IN SCOPE at http://erms.indot.in.gov/Section106Documents/ (the Des. No. is the most

efficient search term, once in IN SCOPE). You are invited to review this document and respond with comments on any historic resource impacts incurred as a result of this project so that an environmental report can be completed. If you prefer a hard copy of this material, please respond to this email with your request within seven (7) days.

Historic Property and District Boundary Map Changes

Project maps have been revised in order to more precisely and accurately depict the boundaries of historic properties. Some mapped historic property and district boundaries shown in the Historic Property Effects Report may appear slightly different since the publication of previous historic property reports. For instance, the depiction of the southwest corner of the Old Northside Historic District on the maps has been slightly revised to better line up with the existing I-65 right-of-way line, which is referenced in the verbal district boundary description of the National Register of Historic Places nomination form for the district

The boundaries for the individually listed historic properties were revised slightly to more accurately depict the existing parcel boundaries.

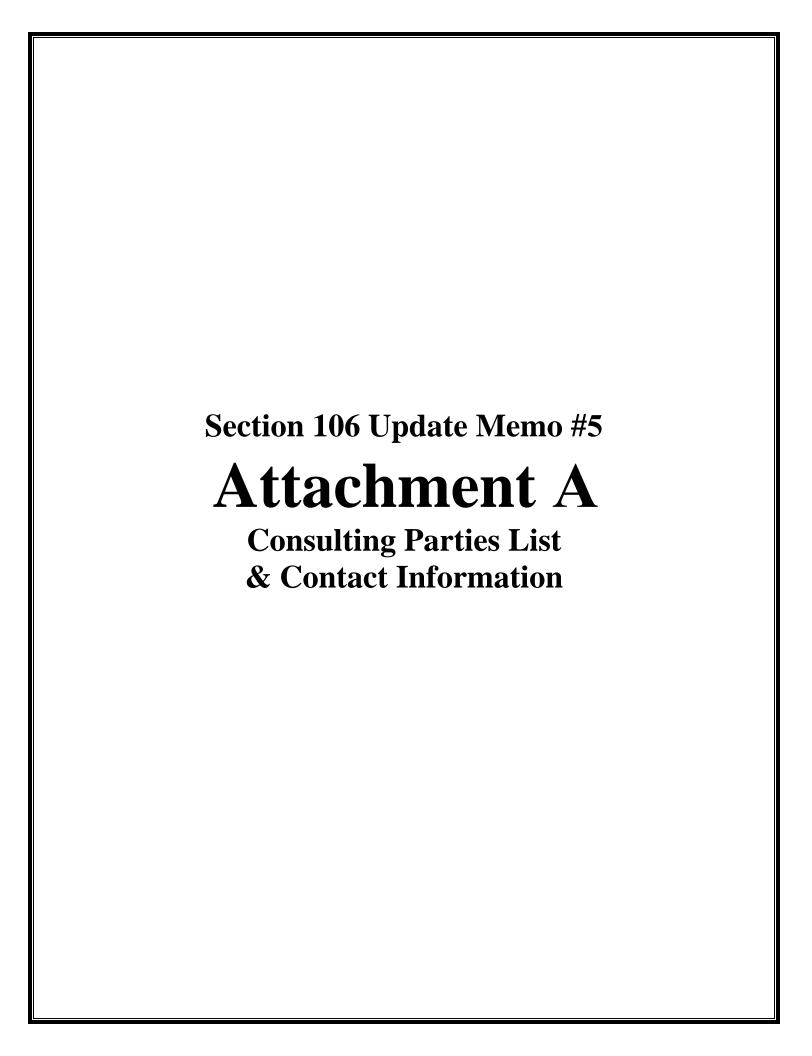

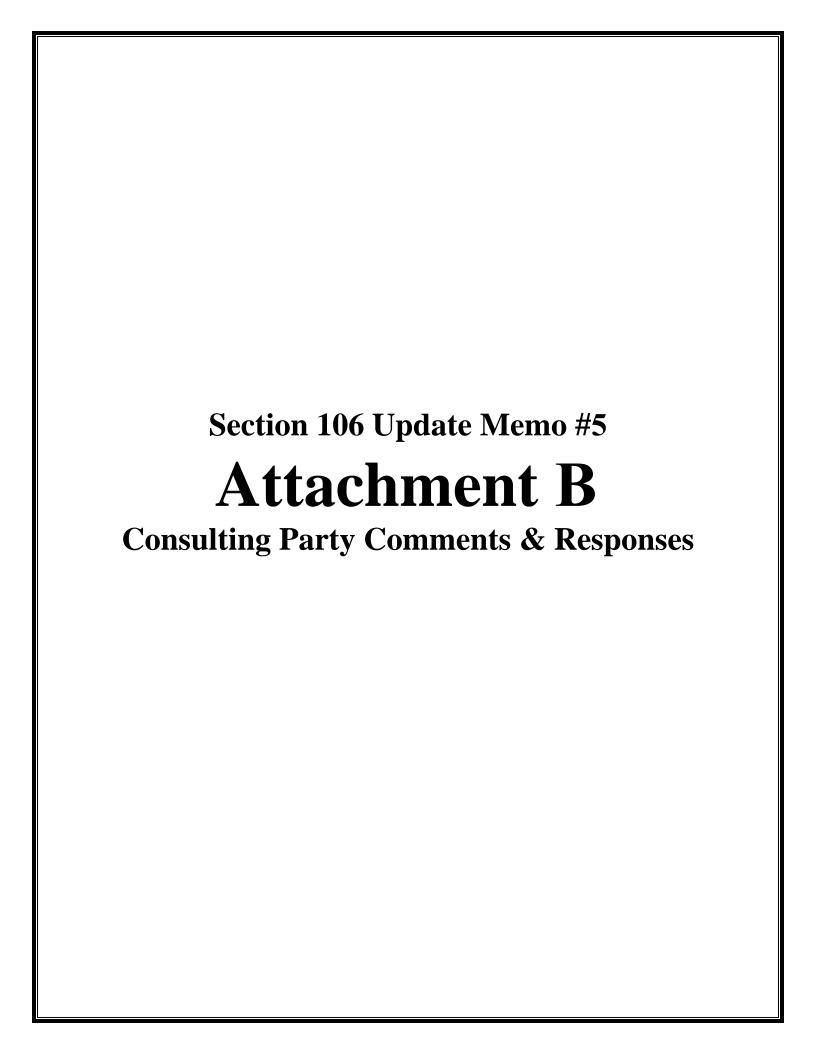

Comment Response

Pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (54 U.S.C. 306108); implementing regulations at 36 C.F.R. Part 800, and the "Programmatic Agreement (PA) Among the Federal Highway Administration, the Department of Transportation, the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation and the Indiana State Historic Preservation Officer Regarding the Implementation of the Federal Aid Highway Program In the State of Indiana" ("Indiana Minor Projects PA"); and also pursuant to Indiana Code 14-21-1-18 and 312 Indiana Administrative Code ("IAC" 20-4. the staff of the Indiana State Historic Preservation Officer and of the Indiana Department of Natural Resources, Division of Historic Preservation and Archaeology, has reviewed INDOT's letter memo with attachments received on March 20, 2019.

Thank you for providing us with an updated consulting/interested parties list and your permanent traffic change analysis, tables, and maps for consideration. It's our understanding that some modifications have been made to preferred Alternative 4C to minimize map closures and allow for greater interstate access; however, some permanent changes to traffic on local streets are anticipated due to diversion. Generally speaking, we believe that increases in vehicular traffic need to be considered in planning projects that could potentially affect cultural and historic properties. We appreciate the level of thought and analysis you have expended in trying to quantify if there would be permanent impacts outside of the currently defined area of potential effects as a result of this undertaking. We have carefully read your conclusions based upon traffic data and modeling applied to the modified Alternative 4C. We agree with your assessment that the minor expected increase in traffic along some arterial streets within primarily commercial areas of the city does not appear to constitute an impact to historic properties, if they exist there, or necessitate an expansion of the undertaking's area of potential effects in this case.

Thank you for your review and concurrence. If modifications are made to the refined Alternative 4C, changes in assumptions or modeling occurs that could substantially affect traffic patterns, this issue will be revisited.

If, due to further project modifications, changes in	
assumptions, future modeling or other data, traffic were	
anticipated to significantly change within commercial, and	
particularly residential areas as a result of the project, we	
would recommend revisiting this issue.

North Square Neighborhood Association – Jordan Ryan – July 18, 2019

The North Square Neighborhood Association (NSNA) does not support INDOT's I-65/I-70 North Split Interchange Reconstruction Project proposal. NSNA supports a study by an independent review panel of experts that incorporates genuine economic development and connectivity strategies into the project, with collaboration from the City of Indianapolis.

The current INDOT/HNTB plan does not address our economic development and connectivity concerns, only lane and wall height concerns. This project should go beyond a traffic and maintenance study. NSNA supports the exploration of an alternative plan that expands upon INDOT's current scope, as well as the use of creative funding tools and innovative partnerships and collaborations in order to enhance our quality of life as a downtown neighborhood that abuts the interstate on our western boundary. The reconstruction plan will set a legacy for another 50 years and we want that to be a positive community-enhancing legacy – a transformative project - that incorporates principles of economic development, multimodal transportation, urban planning, connectivity, environmental sustainability, and historic preservation. Downtown neighborhoods are not exit ramps. We urge a creative solution, such as those offered in peer cities. We ask for particular consideration to economic development opportunities that would redevelop multiple acres of downtown property that could ultimately generate more property taxes and attract new businesses and jobs. These strategies could reconnect our neighborhood, along with Fountain Square, to Fletcher Place and downtown, righting the wrong when the original interstate came through against our neighborhood's wishes and cut us off of downtown, causing an economic downturn we are still recovering from in many ways. In addition, we remind the policymakers that there is an ideological dissonance of pursuing bigger highways through downtown after a majority of city residents passed a mass transit referendum in 2016.

Inner loop options were reviewed in the previously prepared System-Level Analysis of Downtown Interstates and are not addressed in the current study of this individual interchange. The System-Level Analysis analyzed seven concepts for the entire downtown Indianapolis interstate system, including the use of tunnels and boulevards. Estimated costs and traffic operations data are provided for each concept. It was determined that further study would be needed to advance any new system concept and the North Split project should continue due the urgency of need, and the alternatives screening process for the interchange area was initiated.

A study of economic development potential of "excess land" associated the alternatives for the North Split interchange in the Alternatives Screening Report has not been conducted since it would contribute little to the evaluation of the alternatives presented. It is recognized, however, that economic development potential has been a major focus of the Rethink 65/70 Coalition with respect to the full downtown interstate system. In November 2018, the Coalition released an independent economic study developed by ARUP Corporation. The independent study estimated the potential economic benefits of a new concept plan for the downtown interstate system. The study did not evaluate the alternatives for the North Split interchange in the Alternatives Screening Report.

With some adjustment at connecting points, the preliminary recommended preferred alternative for the North Split interchange would not preclude implementation of alternative concepts outside the North Split project area.
